Course description

Alexis de Tocqueville lived during the aftermath of the French Revolution, when France transitioned from aristocracy to democracy. He is widely regarded as one of the most important thinkers on modern democracy. What are the advantages and disadvantages brought by the new equality? What, if anything, can be saved from aristocracy? In studying Tocqueville's classic work you will explore themes such as the dangers of majoritarian tyranny, the opportunities for social advancement, and the phenomenon of individualism. You will gain valuable insights into the nature of democracy and the unique social and political problems posed by it.

All class sessions will be conducted as "seminars," or Socratic conversations, using the week's reading as the subject matter. Students are expected to actively participate in the discussion for the duration of each class session.

Students will be required to submit weekly questions in response to the reading. Examination will further consist of a midterm essay and a final paper.
